Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

We have monthly assemblies at our school to highlight the Virtues. Daily prayers over the announcements also focus on the monthly virtue. Teachers highlight these virtues in their classrooms.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

We have Prayer Tables in each classroom that highlight our faith. There are prominent symbols of our faith in the foyer and throughout the school such as crosses, bibles, and images of Saints.

We work closely in collaboration with the church to serve our community.
