Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

Teachers use the virtues as the foundation of their teaching and learning experiences

- Monthly assemblies are held celebrating the virtues and recognizing students who exemplify the virtues with Virtue certificates
- Inclusion of virtue in quarterly newsletter
- Visible signs in the front foyer highlighting the virtue of the month
- Front display case reflects our Catholic Faith

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

We have Prayer Tables in each classroom that highlight our Faith. There are prominent symbols of our Faith in the foyer and throughout the school such as crosses, Bibles, and images of Saints.

Working in collaboration with St Patrick Church to serve our community.

- Altar: dressed in Liturgical seasonal colours and themes
- Faith Board in Staff room to assist with resources
- Bible, Pascal Candle, and Crucifix are front and centre of Altar
- Religious Banner is displayed
- We have a Peace/Prayer Garden for students and Staff to use for quiet reflection and small liturgies
- A sacred space in each room, including all offices and classrooms
- Crucifix in each classroom
- Daily announcements include Gospel and Scripture readings
- Catholic School Code of Conduct embedded in Progressive Discipline and rehabilitation
- Faith events highlighted in newsletters and website to keep community aware of our faith-based activities
- Scripture quotations and Catholic inspirational devotions embedded within the newsletters
- Pastoral support from administration and staff to community
